

2023 Nebraska End of Legislative Session Report

Nebraska's Unicameral Assembly had a busy 2023 legislative session where <u>approximately 104,000 Nebraskans live in</u> <u>42,000 homes in fewer than 2,000 community associations</u>. More than 1,000 bills were introduced in Nebraska and only 165 passed due to a political filibuster. Therefore, of the bills introduced that would impact community associations, none passed. Below are highlights from the 2023 General Assembly:

LB 49, Change provisions relating to solar energy and wind energy, declare certain instruments void and unenforceable, and provide for a civil cause of action. This bill would prevent community associations from enacting certain regulations on solar panels in covenants. CAI supports efforts by state legislatures to empower community associations to build consensus-based solutions regarding environmental initiatives and opposes government and interest group efforts to override community policy or deed restrictions on single interest issues. Status: Failed

LB 186, Adopt the Unlawful Restrictive Covenant Modification Act. CAI supported this bill, which includes CAI's model legislative language to provide a simplified process for community associations, condominium communities, unit owners associations, residential housing cooperatives, and master associations to remove antiquated and unenforceable discriminatory restrictions contained in association covenants without a vote of the owners. Similar language based on CAI model public policy has been adopted by twelve other states that have a simplified process for removing discriminatory restrictive covenants. CAI's Public Policy on the Removal of Discriminatory Covenants is <u>here</u>. <u>Status: Failed</u>
