- Current Condo Safety Resources: CAI also is providing information and resources to help concerned residents and board members understand structural integrity, maintenance, and reserves. Please share these resources with your constituents currently living in high-rise communities. We continue to engage in conversations with our members, experts, and stakeholders in the community association housing model to strengthen existing standards and public policy in these areas.
- Diversity Resources for Responsible Communities
  - <u>Creating Harmony in Diverse Communities</u>. A new report published by the <u>Foundation for Community Association Research</u> examines the extent of discrimination claims in community associations and suggests that communities with robust communications and active events calendars have fewer complaints.
  - <u>Diverse and Inclusive Communities Guide</u>. To help communities prevent and address
    discrimination complaints, CAI released this resource, which includes an equality
    commitment for communities to adopt, a nondiscrimination policy, harassment education
    and policy, and more.
  - Inclusionary Public Policies. In addition to these new resources, CAI has public policies
    advocating for <u>fair housing</u> and for a simplified process by which community associations
    can amend their documents to <u>remove discriminatory restrictive covenants</u>.
