

Membership Requirements

To qualify as a student member, you must be enrolled in an accredited university or college taking undergraduate or graduate-level courses. Students may not be working full-time in the community association management field or serving on the board of directors of their community association (with the exception of summer or semester breaks). Students are eligible for student membership for up to five years.

Student may be required to provide validation of student status. This could include providing a copy of class schedule, producing academic advisor's name and contact information, or a copy of a letter of enrollment.
