Describe the program and why it fits the category. (20pts)

The CAI Coachella Valley Chapter's Public Affairs initiative focused on strengthening collaboration between community associations and local municipalities while improving public understanding of governance roles, shared responsibilities, and community partnerships. Historically, interaction between the chapter and municipalities had been limited and largely reactive. In 2025, the chapter intentionally expanded its public affairs strategy to position CAI as an educational partner and trusted resource within the broader community.

The chapter partnered with six municipalities — Indio, Indian Wells, Palm Desert, Rancho Mirage, Cathedral City, and Palm Springs — to host joint homeowner workshops designed to clarify the often-misunderstood distinction between municipal services and HOA responsibilities. Educational topics included code enforcement, public safety coordination, infrastructure responsibilities, and effective communication between city leadership and HOA boards.

Six workshops were conducted during 2025, with attendance ranging from approximately 45 to over 100 homeowners per session. Presenters included an estimated five to ten municipal representatives alongside CAI professionals, creating a collaborative and balanced educational environment.

The chapter further expanded its public outreach through participation as exhibitors and sponsors at six regional community events, including State of the County and State of the Valley programs, and through the creation of a professionally branded tri-fold brochure designed to clearly communicate CAI's mission, membership value, and educational resources.

This initiative aligns with the Public Affairs category by advancing public education, strengthening government relationships, and positioning CAI as a proactive partner in improving community understanding.

How did this program meet the mission and vision of the chapter and CAI as a whole including fostering an inclusive environment that reflects and serves our diverse community? (20pts)

This program directly supports CAI's mission to build better communities through education, advocacy, and collaboration. By focusing on public education and municipal partnerships, the chapter helped bridge knowledge gaps that often create frustration among homeowners regarding governance responsibilities.

Workshops were intentionally inclusive and open to all homeowners, regardless of experience or association involvement, ensuring accessibility across diverse communities within the Coachella Valley. The program reinforced CAI's vision as a trusted convener by bringing together city officials, HOA professionals, and residents in constructive dialogue.

Monthly outreach communications distributed to more than 120 city and government contacts strengthened ongoing relationships and ensured consistent engagement beyond individual events.

What was the impact on the chapter and its members after completing the program? (Growth of membership, financial, public awareness, membership value, better chapter/member relationship, chapter operations, etc.) (20 pts)

The program delivered significant and measurable impact for homeowners, industry professionals, and the broader community. Educational workshops clarified the balance between municipal responsibilities and HOA governance, reducing homeowner confusion and enabling managers and board members to have more productive conversations with residents while improving collaboration with city departments.

The initiative substantially elevated CAI's visibility and credibility across the Coachella Valley. Municipalities increasingly recognized the chapter as a trusted educational partner rather than a siloed organization, with cities such as Indian Wells and Palm Desert initiating follow-up collaboration discussions. Participation from government representatives, including Congressman Raul Ruiz's office, further reinforced CAI's role as a respected voice in community governance and public affairs.

Expanded outreach at regional events strengthened public awareness of CAI's mission and improved communication between local governments and HOA communities. Internally, the program increased member pride and volunteer engagement by demonstrating tangible results, supporting member retention, expanding advocacy opportunities, and improving the overall perception of community associations within the region.

The success of this Public Affairs initiative is supported by the following quantifiable outcomes:

Cities participating: 6 (Indio, Indian Wells, Palm Desert, Rancho Mirage, Cathedral City, Palm Springs)

Homeowner attendance across all workshops: 50-150

City and government officials participating as presenters or attendees: 5-6 different city departments

Monthly communications distributed to city and government officials: monthly updates and personal invites to each educational program

Participation by a congressional representative at a chapter legal education program: 1

Increase in city and government official participation at CAI programs year-over-year: Our first city signed as members. (Cathedral City)

This data is significant because it reflects sustained regional engagement and expanding government collaboration. Participation from multiple cities and a federal representative confirms the program's relevance and reach, while homeowner attendance demonstrates strong community demand. Increased involvement from government officials underscores growing trust in CAI as a credible public partner and validates the chapter's leadership role in education, advocacy, and public affairs.

What are your plans to maintain the momentum of this program moving forward? (20 pts)

The chapter is committed to maintaining and expanding this Public Affairs program as a long-term initiative. Future plans include continuing joint workshops with existing partner cities adding Desert Hot Springs, La Quinta, Coachella and Thermal as opportunity presents while deepening collaboration through rotating host locations, expanded topic offerings, and increased involvement from additional municipal departments such as public safety, planning, and public works.

The chapter will continue its proactive outreach to local government and elected officials, intentionally showcasing CAI's role in education, governance, and community building. This includes inviting city leaders and government representatives to attend CAI programs, fostering ongoing dialogue, and exploring additional opportunities to engage federal representatives on local issues impacting community associations.

Long-term goals include formalizing recurring annual workshops with participating cities, developing co-branded educational materials, and integrating public affairs insights into advocacy and legislative initiatives. By sustaining and expanding relationships with Indio, Indian Wells, Palm Desert, Rancho Mirage, Cathedral City, Palm Springs, and engaged government offices, the chapter will continue to strengthen public understanding, enhance cooperation, and reinforce CAI's role as a leader in community association governance.
